The Department of Standards appoints **SIRIM Berhad** as the agent to develop Malaysian Standards. The Department also appoints SIRIM Berhad as the agent for distribution and sale of Malaysian Standards.

NATIONAL FOREWORD

This Malaysian Standard was developed by the Technical Committee on Packaging under the authority of the Packaging and Distribution Industry Standards Committee.

This Malaysian Standard is identical with ISO 780 : 1997(E), 'Packaging – Pictorial marking for handling of goods', published by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO), which has the same title. The text of the International Standard is recommended for publication as a Malaysian Standard. However, for the purpose of this Malaysian Standard, the following apply :

- a) in the source text, "this International Standard" should read "this Malaysian Standard";
- b) the comma which is used as a decimal sign (if any), to read as a full point;
- c) to include the term "trolley" in the instruction No. 9 to read "Do not use hand truck/trolley here"; and
- d) to include the term "trolley" in the meaning of instruction No. 9 to read "Hand trucks/trolleys shall not be placed on this side when handling the transport package".

This standard cancels and replaces MS 984 : 1985 – Code of practice for packaging : Pictorial marking for handling of goods.

Compliance with a Malaysian Standard does not of itself confer immunity from legal obligations.

NOTE. IDT on the front cover indicates an identical standard i.e. a standard where the technical content, structure, wording and presentation of a Malaysian Standard is exactly the same as in an International Standard or is identical in technical content and it may contain the minimal editorial changes specified in clause 4.2 of ISO/IEC Guide 21.
