## **FOREWORD**

This Malaysian Standard was prepared by the Technical Committee on Accident Statistics Terminology under the authority of the Mechanical Engineering Industry Standards Committee.

There has been no uniform method of recording and classifying work injuries. It was decided that it should be most imperative if a national standard method of defining, recording and assessing work injuries be prepared.

Three appendices, on the list of notifiable industrial diseases, the classification of industrial accidents, and on guiding interpretations and examples are included in this Malaysian Standard.
