FOREWORD

This Malaysian Standard was developed by the Technical Committee on Sweeteners and Related Products under the authority of the Industry Standards Committee on Food and Food Products.

This Malaysian Standard is the third revision of MS 83, *Specification and method of test for sugarcane final molasses*.

Major modifications in this revision are as follows:

- a) “reducing sugars” definition has been improved;
- b) methods for determination of total sugars in sugarcane final molasses have been improved; and
- c) clause for hygiene has been added.

This Malaysian Standard cancels and replaces MS 83:1997.
